President's Message

First of all I want to thank you for electing me as your President for 2006 – 2008. As I am new to this job, my comments will be general. First of all, I want to thank those who got this organization started — President Gene Overton, Treasurer Bruce Moore and Chairman Mike Metzger — for handing off a well run organization that has adequate structure in place to do well in the future. Bruce Moore and Peggy, his dear associate are continuing on while Gene and Mike have both moved to the Board where they will be invaluable. Gene will be making his comments elsewhere in this letter, so I will move on.

Beginning in January I started receiving a lot of informational e-mail traffic from the Association, at the Board and Membership meetings as well as in the hospitality room I also heard a lot. I was struck by how few of our members were actually involved with the organization and the lack of communication within it. My feeling was that we were communicating poorly with each other. The communication avenues available were the web-site, which I believe is organized for one-way dissemination of information and a newsletter that comes out several times a year to all our paying members. At this time, I have introduced a third method of communication within the organization in the form of a report that I intend to issue on a monthly/bimonthly basis as information available exists with additional reports coming out when I need to advise you of something quickly. This report is done by mass e-mail and as of the first real report roughly 75% of our paying members received it in their mailbox. Amazingly, it has been out less than a week as I write this and I have received several responses (e-mail can be two-way) from members with suggestions and/or volunteering to help out in a program area they have heard about. If I can not answer the question myself, I forward the note to a person within our organization that will and the questions are being answered in a timely fashion. Unfortunately, this product is not currently available to about 25% of you because you lack e-mail access or have not kept us current on your address. Please send your address updates to Bruce Moore (TheMOE_A1506@msn.com) as he maintains our formal roster. By the time you receive this, if you have not received a report or message from me, you either do not have e-mail or we do not have a correct address. We get error reports in most cases when an e-mail does not go through. Additionally, I have asked those of you who get a report to pass on the information to friends who do not and have already seen evidence that this is happening. This program is clearly not meant to reduce some of you to second class citizens. It is a no-cost benefit to those of us who have e-mail access.

At this time we are very excited about the 'Gathering of Currahees' during the Week of the Eagles. We hope to have details available for the January newsletter. The Currahee! Newsletter remains a principle means of communication with members who do not use e-mail. Newsletters are targeted for late July/early August depending on how information gathering, printing, assembly and mailing goes and the other comes out around the end of the year.

Please remember that we are on an annual dues system with the year's dues due in January. Year round we also have the Quartermaster Store on the website which we are working at making the best source of CURRAHEE materials available.

May 17-21, 2006

After Action Report

The 4th Reunion and General Membership Meeting of the 506th Infantry Association was held at the Sheraton Colorado Springs Hotel from Wednesday May 17 through Saturday May 20, 2006. The site was chosen because it was near Ft. Carson, where Currahee troops who had served as part of the Second Infantry Division in Iraq were stationed. The area offered many favorable amenities to make it an attractive destination. These amenities included the standard tourist amenities of Colorado Springs such as nearness to the Air Force Academy and an active duty Army post, tourist attractions such as the Garden of the Gods and Pikes Peak and an available facility for an independent group of the Association to hold a parachute jump.

People started arriving on Wednesday for a chance to get settled, meet old friends in our hospitality area and/or do some local touring time permitting.

People continued to arrive Thursday and those that arrived in the morning were able to join with the members who had arrived before them for a regimental picnic at Iron Horse Park on Fort Carson. For many of us Easterners this was the first time we had seen sun for a week or so. Joining us at the picnic were Currahees who had served with the 1st Battalion, 506th Infantry in Iraq, a reunion within a reunion where older veterans of the 506th had the opportunity to mix and talk with these younger veterans, an opportunity that continued throughout the reunion. The weather was very favorable for being outdoors in the cooler parts of the day and we took advantage of that. The Board of Directors met late in the day for its final meeting prior to the elections on Friday.

Friday was basically a free day for our members. Some went to ground school in preparation for a parachute jump while others visited local tourist attractions. The General Membership Meeting was held late in the afternoon (Election results are reported under the 'Mission/Vision' tab which is contained in the Organization/Membership tab on the home page.)

The evening featured a Regimental Dining Out (Currahee Memorial Dinner). Our dinner speaker was COL David L. Clark who commanded the 1st Battalion from May 2002 through its last months in Korea and then took the unit to Iraq for a full deployment with the 2nd Brigade of the Second Infantry Division. He returned the unit to Fort Carson at the end of the deployment and left the 1/506 in September 2005. His dinner talk was most educational and enjoyable, as was his presence. Following the dinner, some of us adjourned to the hospitality room or quiet spaces in the hotel to talk with friends. The air is a bit thin at the foothills of the Rockies. Some of us were feeling its effects and simply went to bed.

On Saturday, we had the choice of touring the Colorado Springs area or of going to the parachute drop area for a Memorial Ceremony and lunch catered by a fine barbeque restaurant from Colorado City. Following lunch, the crowd pretty much divided with the jumpers and their families staying at the airport while the rest headed off on individual pursuits.

By now, some of us were tiring a bit due to the effects of the Colorado sunny blue sky and breezes or last chance efforts to get the perfect Colorado souvenir. Saturday evening was highlighted by informal unit dinners and easy conversations with friends throughout the hotel. The reunion was effectively over.

Airplanes take off early from Colorado Springs so some of us found ourselves on 6:00 AM flights home. Others managed to get together with friends for one last breakfast. A few parties got together for independent touring of the Colorado area or joint drives that visited sites of interest while heading in the general direction of home. Based on some of the comments, many of our members felt that this was the best reunion we had since we held our first elections in 2000. All in all, it was a bunch of 'happy Currahees' that left Colorado with plans to have a less formal gathering next year at Fort Campbell.

President's Report

July 18, 2006

I thought this month and in the future not only would I bring you up to date on what we have done or are planning as an organization, but also highlight things that our members have done for others from who share in the '506th bond.' An organization can be and should be measured both by what it officially does and what its members do.

Association Notes:

The Association is still committed to holding 'A Gathering of Currahees' in conjunction with the Week of the Eagles. Currently, the dates have not been set by the Division to the best of our knowledge but once the Division is home and details of the new CG's arrival are set, the dates will probably follow. In the past the Division pattern has been to have a series of events building to a strong final day. We generally have staged our meetings over three days, so it is probably reasonable to expect that the RCT will follow the Division pattern and we will want to be there for the final day. As better information becomes available it will be published on our web page, in this letter and in the newsletter.

Corrections to previous report: In my report of June 19 I erroneously indicated that Ron Helwig did most of the work regarding the Currahee packages. In actual fact, Fred May does most of the work with Ron Helwig as his back-up. As I was starting to get familiar with Association actions, Fred was on vacation and Ron was backing him up, hence my mistake. I apologize to both these gentlemen for my oversight and commend them for a job well done.

Antonio "Tony" Gomes, the son of Jerry and Kaye Gomes, was awarded our first scholarship. Tony will be attending the Oregon State University at Corvallis this fall as a sophomore. Jerry, his father, served in the 3/506 and is an active member of our Association. We wish Tony success in his higher education.

Because the scholarship fund will make its expenditures once a year, we invested the remaining funds that we currently have in two CDs using the laddering principal. The interest earned (We got rates of 3.83% for six months and 4.12% for 12 months.) will be directly credited to the scholarship fund with the hope that as time goes by we will be able to fund one or more scholarships from invested funds and another from annual contributions, as well as slightly raise the amount we invest in our youth.

Certain costs of the parachute jump in Colorado, primarily for souvenirs, were charged to the Association that should not have been. The funds held as temporarily restricted funds for the parachutists were exhausted in making a partial payment on the bill and Association funds were used to make up the difference, as we have a need to protect our name and our credit rating. We hold the remaining inventory as security for the debt and fully expect to recover our costs plus maybe some profit over time.

A recent feature is letters received regarding the Currahee Packages we send. Although not all of the 30 units to which the Association is sending packages have responded, most have, so we reworked/expanded the Thank-You's from Iraq 2006 web site section which is accessed from the 2006 Currahee Package Project section of the Scholarship Fund and Special Projects web page.

A final comment about the two funds we have that directly assist our present CURRAHEES: From January 1 through June 30, we spent \$1,792.36 for gifts and financial assistance from the Widows, Orphans and Wounded Soldiers Fund divided among 42 soldiers and their families. During the same period we spent \$7,343.94 on 90 Currahee Packages (totaling over 3,000 pounds) mailed to the companies in the RCT.

Mike Bookser has added a "Looking For" section to the Currahee Forum (www.506infantry.org/forum). This will allow Currahee veterans to create their own "Looking For" entries to help locate Currahees with whom they served.

An issue came up about e-mail distribution of the Association newsletter. For the time being, the newsletter will only be distributed to paid-up members with a very few exceptions as determined by me.

Larry's community has pitched in to cover all costs, transportation and meals for the troops and their family members.

The work of the Hospitality Visitation Team, whose activities are centered on Walter Reed, headed by Bob Seitz draws praise from both RCT and Division Command level. We can all take pride in their achievements. We also have teams at Blanchfield Army Hospital, Fort Campbell and San Antonio which are doing good work.

Supporting the Entire 506th Regimental Combat Team

Since the Board of Directors voted to support the entire 506th Regimental Combat Team (RCT), the Association has moved into high gear. The units which comprise the 506th RCT contain approximately 3700 soldiers and are as follows:

HHC 506th RCT

1st Battalion 506th Infantry (Red Currahee)
2nd Battalion 506th Infantry (Renegades)
1st Squadron 61st Cavalry (Currahee Cav)
4th Special Troops Battalion (BTB)
4th Battalion 320th Field Artillery (Tomahawks)
801st Support Battalion (BSB)

All of these units are currently deployed to Iraq and are located in some of the worst areas of that country.

Our support of the active duty 506th RCT consists of three projects / funds:

- **Currahee Packages:** Care packages are being sent to all 30 companies / troops / batteries of the entire 506th Regimental Combat Team as long as they remain in Iraq. As of August 15, 2006 we have shipped 125 bushel sized boxes with a total weight of *over two tons*. Recently, we have increased our rate of shipping from three boxes a week to five a week. This means we are now shipping approximately 800 lbs of "stuff" a month. All items are now being shipped by me from my home in West Milford, NJ. My basement has been turned into Currahee Package Central and is filled with packing materials and all the "stuff" needed by our troops. Our hope is that the items we send make the Currahees stay in Iraq just a little bit better.
- **Scholarship Program:** Established to help provide financial assistance to Currahee veterans and active duty Currahees as well as their family members. The Scholarship Committee met at the recent 506th reunion and wishes to announce that Antonio Gomes from Sandy, Oregon is the winner of our 2006 \$500 College Scholarship. Tony is currently a freshman at Oregon State University located in Corval-

lis, Oregon. The Association would like to congratulate Tony, as this years scholarship applicant pool provided very stiff competition.

- **Widows, Orphans and Wounded Soldiers Fund:** Established to provide financial assistance to spouses, family members and children of Currahees killed in action, missing in action, or wounded in action. Since January 2006, this Fund has provided monetary assistance to a number of family members of Currahees KIA. This assistance has been vital in allowing these members to attend funerals of loved ones far from home. In addition, this fund provides the money for Currahee flags and pins to be presented to KIA next of kin at the Remembrance Ceremony which takes place at Fort Campbell. The WO&WS Fund also funds the visitation teams the Association has at four Army Hospitals in the US. All soldiers at these facilities are now visited on a regular basis and presented with Currahee hats, pins, coins, gym bags and phone cards.

In order to accomplish this mission the Association needs your support in the form of monetary donations. As our fellow Currahees go about accomplishing their assigned tasks in Iraq let's show them that Currahee veterans, family members and friends back home fully support them. Let them really know what is meant by our Association Motto - "WE STAND TOGETHER - THEN, NOW, AND ALWAYS".
