Significant Activities:

- a. MEDCAPS: The 3d Brigade maintained a good steady Medcap Program throughout the reporting period. The Brigade held a total of 37 Medcaps and treated a total of 2,776 individuals. Medcaps were held in Phong Dien, Quang Dien and Huong Dien Districts, with an attempt to place emphasis on target hamlets as outlined in the 1969 Pacification Plan. A decrease in the availability of medically trained personnel due to operational requirements is the only outstanding Medcap problem encountered during the reporting period by the Brigade.
- b. Distribution of Foodstuffs: The 3d Brigade initiated a massive food distribution program during the reporting period. Seventy-three thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, (73,790), poinds of food were distributed by the Brigade to refugees and other needy persons. Distribution of food was carried out on a daily basis during resettlement operations and when emergencies arose. On 9 July 1969, fire broke out in the refugee village of Con Son. Two hundred and sixty-one homes were destroyed. The 3d Brigade provided emergency fire fighting equipment and emergency food supplies. One hundred and ninety cases of "C" rations, 1,150 pounds of rice and 1,000 pounds of corn meal were distributed the same day as the fire.
- c. Distribution of Scrap Lumber: The Brigade distributed 112,200 pounds of scrap lumber to refugees and other needy individuals during the reporting period. Lumber was used by individuals to repair homes and make furniture. Hamlets and villages used the scrap lumber to build such items as chicken coops, homes and hamlet headquarters with furniture. The refugee village of Gia Long II, YD530348, used scrap lumber and three bags of cement to build a hamlet headquarters with furniture. The building was completed in time to be used as a polling place for the hamlet's first hamlet-chief election. Scrap lumber was used to build the ballot box and voting. booths also.

e. Aid to Education: The majority of the 3d Brigade's construction projects were in support of schools. New schools were built or are being built (3), existing schools were repaired (2), and school furniture and equipment were provided. Materials furnished schools during the reporting period are listed below:

- f. Aid to Agriculture: The 3d Brigade's Agricultural Program during the reporting period consisted of a ding various people with chicken and pig production. The Brigade has provided needy people with 600 chickens and about 2,000 pounds of feed, in addition to building chicken coops. The Brigade also provided slop in the form of messhall garbage to three Vietnamese families raising a total of 72 pigs.

Lessons Learned.

- a. During the reporting period, it was fully realized that when the Vietnamese were given small amounts of scrap material to utilize as they felt best, it would many times provide the needed inducement for the people to initiate projects that would benefit all. Knowing that these projects would benefit all, the hamlet-chiefs would receive wholehearted support, thus creating group unity and quick completion. This can be best exemplified by the construction of a tamlet headquarters at Gia Long II, YD530348, and chicken coops at Gia Long I, YD528348, and Gia Long II, YD530348.
- Indifferent attitudes have sometimes been observed from district-chiefs. It has been found that if the hamlet chiefs are requested to coordinate their projects more before and during construction with the district-chief, the involvement of the districtchief creates self-pride in the people's accomplishments and promotes Pro-GVN feelings from the people, who then know the government is interested in their welfare.
